#### Lesson Purpose:

To discuss the stages that is unique to infants. Trainees will be given information to use caution and insight to unfamiliar situations.

- Guidelines for safely feeding an infant

- Guidelines to safely bath an infant

Discuss & review all the different skills that a trainee may encounter will watching an infant	Ensure that you re-enforce that infants under 5 months will need to neck supported by caregiver.	5 mins
Discuss different bottles and methods for feeding time. Show at least 2 different types of common bottles used	<ul> <li>Hand cleansing</li> <li>Show bottle types</li> <li>Discuss milk &amp; formula options</li> <li>Correct heating and temperature issues</li> <li>Safety while holding or using high chairs</li> <li>Burping infants</li> <li>Solid foods</li> <li>Food allergies</li> <li>Methods to spoon feed</li> </ul>	15 mins.
Discuss methods used to change an infant Demonstrate how to clean & diaper an infant Have all trainees clean & diaper their infant	<ul> <li>Getting supplies together before getting started</li> <li>Not to get interrupted while changing infant</li> <li>Different types of diapers available</li> <li>When infant may require changing</li> <li>Method to change an infant safely</li> <li>Proper cleaning method to avoid infections</li> <li>Be watchful while changing male infants</li> <li>Use of creams only if requested by a parent</li> <li>Properly dispose of diaper</li> <li>Washing up after finished changing</li> </ul>	15 mins.

	POINTS/METHODS	
Discuss how change an infant safely and simply Demonstrate how to dress an infant Have trainees pair up & practice dressing an infant	<ul> <li>Use clothes parent leave out for infant</li> <li>Pick out clothes that are easier to put on(snaps/zippers)</li> <li>Methods to put on clothes</li> <li>Overhead then one arm at a time</li> <li>Put socks on from toes up onto leg</li> <li>Pants on one leg at a time</li> <li>Dispose of dirty clothes</li> </ul>	10 mins.
Discuss safely picking up and holding an infant Demonstrate shoulder and cradle holds Have trainees practice both holds	<ul> <li>Support neck always</li> <li>Shoulder hold also good for calming and burping</li> <li>Cradle hold excellent way to feed &amp; soothe infant to sleep</li> </ul>	10 mins
Discuss sleeping techniques that can help an infant	<ul> <li>Have a calm environment</li> <li>Use music or stories</li> <li>Place infant on back or side</li> <li>Cradle hold and rocking can help</li> <li>Colic baby's can be wrapped in blanket if parents wish</li> </ul>	5 mins.
Discuss the process of bathing an infant safely Show trainees different bathing products that can be used Demonstrate washing face technique (eyes outward)	<ul> <li>Parents and experienced sitters should only bath an infant</li> <li>Be very careful when bathing and infant</li> <li>Have all supplies ready</li> <li>Have phone in bathroom for emergency use only</li> </ul>	10 mins



TEACHING OBJECTIVES	TEACHING POINTS/METHODS	TIME
(Cont"d)	<ul> <li>Never leave bathroom</li> <li>Keep bathroom warm &amp; draft free</li> <li>Test water temperature before putting infant in bath</li> <li>Use of towel to avoid slipping</li> <li>Use infant soaps &amp; shampoos</li> <li>Place a warm washcloth on infant to keep them warm</li> <li>Always start at face &amp; end at the hair</li> <li>Wash eyes first starting at nose &amp; wipe outward</li> <li>Never use cotton swabs to clean ears</li> <li>Wash infants bottom from front to back</li> <li>Do not use any powders</li> <li>Infants can drown in very</li> <li>little water when bathing</li> </ul>	
Discuss toys that are intended for an infant Activity page11	<ul> <li>Infants will not play with you, you need to play with them</li> <li>Age appropriate toys</li> <li>Toys are not always needed</li> <li>Songs and clapping games are good alternatives</li> </ul>	5-10 mins



TEACHING OBJECTIVES	TEACHING POINTS/METHODS	TIME
TEACHING OBJECTIVES (Discuss safety rules when taking care of an infant	<ul> <li>When you feel you have to take a break, put infant in safe place (crib) &amp; take a few minutes for yourself</li> <li>When you get frustrated or angry NEVER shake an infant</li> <li>Never put blankets, pillows or stuffed toys in cribs to avoid</li> </ul>	5 mins
	<ul> <li>suffocation</li> <li>Use all safe guards provided (safety straps, safety latches, door/window locks, gates, ect.)</li> </ul>

TEACHING OBJECTIVES	POINTS/METHODS	TIMIT		
Discuss different abilities a toddler may have	<ul> <li>1-3 years old</li> <li>Need to always tell toddler what you want them to do</li> <li>A lot of patience is needed</li> </ul>	5 mins.		
Discuss different feeding techniques	<ul> <li>Possible food options</li> <li>Always discuss with parents</li> <li>Which foods are possible choking hazard</li> <li>Foods which can cause food allergies or allergic reactions</li> </ul>	5 mins.		
Discuss safely changing a toddler	<ul> <li>Ask for toddlers help</li> <li>Lay toddler down(never allow them to stand up)</li> <li>Proper wiping direction to help avoid infections</li> <li>Place dirty diaper out of toddlers reach</li> <li>Wash yours and toddlers hands after</li> </ul>	15 mins.		
Discuss challenges helping toddlers use the washroom	<ul> <li>Have parents tell you the toddlers routine</li> <li>Tell the toddler to go often</li> <li>Be patient, accidents happen</li> <li>Take a book or favorite toy in with you</li> <li>Always instruct the toddler to go to washroom don't ask</li> <li>Wash yours and toddlers hands after</li> </ul>	10 mins.

	POINTS/METHODS	
Discuss challenges that may occur dressing toddlers	<ul> <li>Don't worry about clothes matching</li> <li>If possible allow toddler to pick out clothes</li> <li>Look for clothes with snaps and zippers</li> <li>Take weather and ease of dressing into consideration</li> </ul>	5 mins.
Playtime with Toddlers Show examples of age appropriate toys Do activity on page 17	<ul> <li>Pick appropriate toys for age &amp; skill</li> <li>Enforce the concept of having to watch a toddler every second</li> <li>Ensure all safety latches and devices are always used</li> <li>Always put all things well out of toddlers reach</li> <li>Naptime routine important to recharge you and toddler</li> </ul>	10 mins.
Discuss bath time for a toddler	<ul> <li>Have everything you need with you before you start</li> <li>Check water temperature before toddler gets in</li> <li>NEVER leave a toddler unattended in a bath</li> <li>Use safety devices such as bath ring &amp; spout guards</li> <li>Bring in phone for emergencies only</li> <li>Use mild soaps around the eye area</li> <li>Drain bath water and clean bath room up</li> </ul>	10 mins.

	POINTS/METHODS	
Discuss behavior problems	• Toddlers are easily frustrated when we do not understand	
Discuss as a group ways to redirect toddlers attention to different activities	<ul> <li>them</li> <li>You need patience for the both of you</li> <li>Try to redirect their attention to a more favourable activity</li> <li>Tantrums are not uncommon in toddlers</li> <li>All you can do is wait tantrums out</li> <li>Make sure the toddler can not hurt themselves</li> <li>Console toddler when the tantrum is over</li> <li>Never shake a toddler</li> </ul>	15 mins.

TEACHING OBJECTIVES	TEACHING POINTS/METHODS	TIME
Discuss the skills and abilities that a preschooler may have Discuss as a group, different skills that a preschooler may have	<ul> <li>Ages 4 – 6 years old</li> <li>Very independent</li> <li>Want to do most things by themselves</li> <li>Still require constant supervision</li> </ul>	5 mins.
Discuss challenges that may happen during meal times	<ul> <li>Child may assert own tastes</li> <li>If they refuse to eat, don't make a fuse over it</li> <li>Have child present when parents tell you about foods</li> <li>All children need to be sitting down at meal time</li> <li>Possible food allergies and choking hazards</li> </ul>	5 mins.
Getting a preschooler dressed	<ul> <li>Usually dress them selves with little help</li> <li>Possibly need help putting on socks or tying shoes</li> <li>May pick unusual clothes for season or activities</li> <li>Make suggestions when needed</li> </ul>	5 mins.
Playtime with a preschooler Show examples of appropriate toys Discuss as a group, different games and activities that a preschool aged child would enjoy	<ul> <li>These children enjoy playing with others</li> <li>May want to be in charge</li> <li>Allow child to make rules if appropriate for that activity</li> <li>If out side make sure you are constantly within an arms length of the child (ex. While on bike)</li> </ul>	20 mins
Do activity on page 27	• Make sure all safety equipment that is supplied is used (helmet, elbow pads, ect.)	



TEACHING OBJECTIVES	TEACHING POINTS/METHODS	TIME
Sleep time for a preschooler Washroom routines for preschoolers	<ul> <li>Physically need to get plenty of sleep</li> <li>You don't do yourself or child any good by ignoring naps and bedtimes</li> <li>Use quiet activities before sleep time (reading, or songs)</li> <li>Try to use same habits as parent use</li> <li>Remind child often to use washroom</li> <li>Respect the child's privacy</li> <li>Only assist if needed</li> <li>DO NOT let them lock bathroom door</li> <li>Make sure the child washes their hands after finished</li> <li>Clean bathroom area up</li> </ul>	5 mins. 5 mins.

Discuss possible behavior problems	<ul> <li>Make sure the child knows what you expect from them</li> <li>Stay consistent with the discipline method of parent</li> <li>Remember to be in charge, but above all be fair</li> </ul>	5 mins.

TEACHING OBJECTIVES	TEACHING	TIME
	POINTS/METHODS	
<ul> <li>Discuss as a group, situations that can pose as a potential problem through scenarios (2 or more scenarios)</li> <li>1. Sitting on porch watching a child ride a bike on the side walk</li> <li>2. While at the park with 2 or more children, 1 needs to use the washroom</li> <li>3. Putting an infant down for nap &amp; a preschooler wants to watch television</li> <li>4. Bathing a toddler and the infant wakes up crying</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Always supervise play</li> <li>When outside, be aware of your surrounding and who is around you and child(ren)</li> <li>Trust your instincts and feelings</li> </ul>	10 mins.
Discuss situations when parents need to be called	<ul> <li>Child won't stop crying</li> <li>Fever</li> <li>Vomiting</li> <li>Sudden &amp; severe pain</li> </ul>	5 mins.
Discuss when & how to call 911	<ul> <li>Review problems to call 911</li> <li>911 has interpreter service</li> <li>Always call 911 before parents</li> <li>Review landline, cell &amp; pay phones</li> <li>Questions that will be asked by EMS</li> </ul>	10 mins.
Discuss Look, Talk, Call & A, B, C	<ul> <li>Same for child or infant regardless of age</li> <li>Scene Safety (your number 1!)</li> <li>Checking for responsiveness</li> <li>Call 911</li> </ul>	20 mins.

TEACHING ODJECTIVES	POINTS/METHODS	
(Cont'd) Demonstrate head tilt & chin lift, Look, listen & feel Have trainees practice head tilt & chin lift, Look, listen & feel Demonstrate recovery position Have trainees pair up and practice recovery position	<ul> <li>Head tilt chin lift</li> <li>Check for breathing</li> <li>Look, listen &amp; feel</li> <li>If child breathing, put in recovery position</li> <li>Circulation checking for breathing skin colour temperature &amp; movement.</li> <li>Can get help from ambulance 911 operator for any other care needed, such as with CPR, severe bleeding, unconscious children, ect.</li> <li>No CPR is taught in this course recommend that they take a certification course thought your company</li> </ul>	
Discuss choking prevention Discuss as a group, different things that can be a choking hazard that are unusual Demonstrate technique for infant severe airway obstruction Practice as a group severe airway obstruction for infant Demonstrate technique for child severe airway obstruction with a trainee Practice as a group child choking with severe airway obstruction	<ul> <li>Walking with anything in mouth is dangerous</li> <li>Toothbrush, hairbrush, pencils, real keys, bottles or soothers that are broken or wore out</li> <li>Explain mild airway obstruction</li> <li><b>DO NOT</b> slap child on back</li> <li>Teach infant choking for a severe airway obstruction on Actar infants.</li> <li>Teach child severe airway obstruction using trainees in pairs</li> </ul>	20 mins.



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TEACHING OBJECTIVES	TEACHING	TIME
	POINTS/METHODS	
Discuss how to stop and deal with a bleed and care of wounds to avoid infection Demonstrate how to dress a wound Have trainees pair up and dress a wound	<ul> <li>R rest</li> <li>D direct pressure</li> <li>Do not lift or replace cloth</li> <li>Call 911 when bleed is squirting, impaled, bleeds for more than 20 mins, any problems with airway or breathing</li> <li>Care for a nose bleed</li> <li>Rest, pinch soft part of nose, hold for 10-15 minutes</li> <li>Smaller wounds non active bleed clean with warm soapy water and put on bandage to avoid infections</li> <li>When to call parents</li> </ul>	15 mins.
Discuss with trainees illnesses that may occur and how to deal with the illness Have trainees break into 2-3 groups and do activity on page 38 and discuss any new hazards	<ul> <li>Signs &amp; symptoms of an asthma attack</li> <li>If child has puffer to have child use it</li> <li>When to call 911 &amp; then parents</li> <li>What signs to expect if a child has a seizure (clonic/tonic)</li> <li>Not to hold child down, put nothing in their mouth, move dangerous objects</li> <li>Call 911 first then parents</li> <li>When finished put child in recovery position</li> <li>What to expect from the child after the seizure</li> <li>Give examples of things that can poison children</li> <li>Watch airway &amp; breathing</li> <li>Call 911 then call parents</li> </ul>	15 mins.



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TEACHING OBJECTIVES	TEACHING POINTS/METHODS	TIME
Discuss signs & symptoms of severe allergic reactions	<ul> <li>Make sure you know where child's EpiPen is</li> <li>Parents have shown you when &amp; how to use it</li> <li>Shortness of breath, wheezing, coughing, swelling of throat, mouth or tongue</li> <li>Call 911 and watch airway &amp; breathing</li> </ul>	5 mins.
Discuss signs & symptoms and prevention of burns	<ul> <li>Things that cause burns</li> <li>Do not remove clothing that is stuck</li> <li>Cool water for 10 minutes</li> <li>cover with dry dressing</li> <li>Call 911 if burns to face, neck, chest or airway or breathing problems</li> <li>Then call parents</li> </ul>	5 mins
Discuss further safety tips	<ul> <li>Act like parents are home when on the phone</li> <li>Never let strangers in the house</li> <li>Watch for no go zones on active farms</li> <li>Never leave stove unattended when on</li> <li>Know the family fire escape plan &amp; remember STOP, DROP &amp; ROLL</li> <li>Always stay close to children outside</li> <li>Always use all protective equipment provided</li> </ul>	5 mins.
